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The Lakemont golf course was built in two phases beginning in 1988. John LaFoy designed the layout with the front 9 holes played around Stone Mountain Lake. Incredible views of the World's largest Exposed Granite mountain along with the famous Confederate Memorial carving featuring Robert E. Lee, Jefferson Davis and Stonewall Jackson on horseback makes the front nine a memorable experience. Six holes have water in play making it not only spectacular, but a strong test of accuracy. Signature holes on the front side include #1, a double dogleg par 5 over water and around a granite outcropping and #3, a medium length par 4. The 6th hole, a former short dogleg par 4, was renovated in 2000 and shortened to a beautiful par 3 over water and is noted as well. The backside of Lakemont offers several interesting and beautiful holes, as well. Although this side is more inland, away from the lake and Stone Mountain, it is as difficult and scenic as the front. Several holes have rock outcroppings and 4 of the holes have water that does come into play. LaFoy's penchant for mounding and dramatic bunkering is also evident throughout the backside.

Stonemont, the original 18 hole layout, was designed and built in 1969 by the Father of Modern Golf Architecture, Robert Trent Jones Sr. With his passing in June of 2000, Stonemont will remain the only Jones Sr. designed course, open to the public, in the State of Georgia. His masterpiece was built in a setting "so magical that it truly seemed as though God, Himself, had created (it) with a golf course in mind," as Jones noted in 1999, in a letter to Stone Mountain Golf Club commemorating the restoration of his layout. Stonemont is laid out over gently rolling and cantered fairways of premier Bermuda grass and greens of immaculate bent grass. The par 70 layout stretches 6845 yards making it not only long, but brutish at times with its narrow fairways, strategically placed bunkers and numerous stands of Georgia pines. Additionally, on the front side there are several nearly-hidden creeks and drainways challenging even the straightest of drivers. Even more diabolical is the way Jones used the natural slope and contour of the land to increase the difficulty of shots not played to the correct areas. These subtle contours often play mind games with the golfer whether he stands on the tee or in the fairway, making the mental approach to playing Stonemont of utmost importance. The backside is a very scenic and well-paced 9 holes that test every facet of one's game. Par is an excellent adversary on Stonemont as every hole presents a unique and calculated challenge sure to leave one thirsting for revenge.

DIRECTIONS:

From North to Atlanta:

I-85 South or I-75 South or GA 400 South to I-285. Travel east on I-285 to Exit 39-B (South Mountain Freeway / Hwy 78 East). Travel approximately 7.5 miles to exit 8 the exit to Stone Mountain Park's Main Entrance.

From South of Atlanta:

I-85 North or I-75 North to I-285 east. Travel east on I-285 to Exit 39B (South Mountain Freeway / Hwy 78 East). Travel approximately 7.5 miles to the exit for Stone Mountain Park's Main Entrance.

From East to Atlanta:

Hwy 78 West to the exit for Stone Mountain Park...OR...

I-20 West to I-285. Travel north on I-285 to Exit (Stone Mountain Freeway/Hwy 78 east). Travel approximately 7.5 miles to the exit for Stone Mountain Park's Main Entrance.

From West of Atlanta:

I-20 East through downtown Atlanta to I-285. Travel north on I-285 to Exit 39(South Mountain Freeway / Hwy 78 East). Travel approximately 7.5 miles to the exit for Stone Mountain Park's Main Entrance.

From Downtown Atlanta:

I-20 East to I-285 Travel north on I-285 to Exit 39 (Stone Mountain Freeway/Hwy 78 East). Travel approximately 7.5 miles to the exit for Stone Mountain Park's Main Entrance.

From Buckhead:

East Paces Ferry to Roxboro Road

Turn right onto Roxboro Road (the name will change to North Druid Hill Road)

Follow 6 miles to Hwy 78 East

Follow 8 miles to Stone Mountain Entrance

From Hartsfield International Airport:

I-85 South to I-285 Travel east on I-285 to Exit 39B (Stone Mountain Freeway/Hwy 78 East). Travel approximately 7.5 miles to the exit for Stone Mountain Park's Main Entrance.
